Comprehensibility/Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student provides a comprehensible, complete response that indicates understanding of the question. The student may make an attempt to give a more elaborate response. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student provides a basic but comprehensible response. The response may be a correct answer, but it is incomplete. The teacher may have to repeat the question once. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student does not understand the question and cannot answer it even after the teacher has slowly repeated it twice.
Fluency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student gives a fluid response. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student pauses or hesitates, but the listener still comprehends. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student speaks haltingly with excessively long pauses that detract from the listener's ability to comprehend.
Accuracy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are minimal to no grammatical errors. The student will self-correct any conjugation errors. The student uses the correct words to express what he/she is saying. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are various grammatical errors, but the student is still comprehensible. The student uses the correct verb for the meaning he/she wants to convey, but the grammatical use is incorrect. The student may use a vocabulary word incorrectly, but the intended meaning is still understood from the context. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Grammatical errors are so frequent that the student is no longer comprehensible. The student cannot figure out what verb should be used to answer. The student uses several words incorrectly.
Pronunciation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student correctly pronounces all or all but one of the words in the answer. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student pronounces most of the words in the answer correctly. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The student mispronounces all or almost all of the words in the response.
