

READING & LANGUAGE ARTS

(foundational subjects)

- WHY do we read and write?
 - TO LEARN READING & WRITING
 - See and practice a variety of writing conventions, structures of content, vocabulary, idea expressions
 - TO EXPLORE VARIOUS, INFORMED
 CONTENT
 - Exposure and response to various perspectives - self and world (subjectivity in reading & writing)

READING & LANGUAGE ARTS (foundational subjects)

- HOW do we read and write?
 - Consistent processes (ie. the Writing Process)
 - Various strategies (ie. pre-reading, context clues, visualizing, Think Aloud - talking about our thoughts, brainstorming)
 - Various support (ie. models, resources, & collaboration)
 - With appreciation of our individual journey (ie. self-assessment and reflection to help us improve, celebrating our successes)
- What are the benefits?
 - Helps us succeed in all other subjects
 - Prepares us for real-life scenarios

READING/ LANGUAGE ARTS

- CONTENT
 - Isolated Studies
 - Reading, writing, grammar, spelling, & vocabulary
 - Integrated Studies
 - How does each element fit together?
 - -How can we actively use grammar concepts in our writing?
 - -How does analyzing text structure help us learn how to write?
 - -How does knowledge of vocabulary strengthen our reading skills?

READING/ LANGUAGE ARTS

- INSTRUCTION
 - Whole Group
 - Teaching of content and skills needed for small-group and independent work
 - Small Group
 - Centers (independent & self-directed activities)
 - Reading/Writing Strategy Groups reinforce skills at differentiated levels
 - Student/Teacher Conferences
 - Individualized reading and writing instruction

 - Book Reports







MEET ASSIGNMENT DUE DATES MISSING/INCOMPLETE HOMEWORK

- LONG-TERM HOMEWORK (IE. BOOK REPORT):
 - LATE DAY 1 > Points deducted
 - LATE DAY 2 > Additional points deducted; additional consequence discussed by teacher and student
- DAILY HOMEWORK:
 - Points deducted
 - The completed homework assignment should be returned the next school day. If not, (an) additional consequence(s) will be discussed.
 - After <u>2</u> missed homeworks, a homework slip will be sent home and then returned to school the next day with a parent signature.

WHERE CAN HOMEWORK BE FOUND?

- STUDENT PLANNER
 - *End of Day Homeroom: All homework given (general education subjects and specials) is reviewed and written on the homework board, along with the materials needed to complete it.
- HOMEWORK FOLDER
- GOOGLE CLASSROOM (at times)
 - If Google homework cannot be completed for any reason, students are asked to tell me before leaving school, so we can work out an alternative option for completing the assignment.

ABSENCES

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- Out of school
- *In school at band, Enrichment, Student Council, the nurse, etc.

"WHILE YOU WERE OUT" BOX

- Student name is recorded on the Absence Calendar
- Missed work is written down and ready for your child when he or she returns to school

ASSESSMENT

- Graded on WHAT we learn (the content) and HOW we learn (skills)
- Small PARTICIPATION GRADE in each subject
 - Class Participation Rubric
 - Independent assignments collected and reviewed for completion
 - Individual assignments with day-to-day participation requirements
- Self-assessment (ownership for their growth)
 - Self-reflection rubrics/checklists
 - Written reflections
 - Progress Logs

 - Timer, due dates for long-term assignments
- Organization
 - Personal space, classroom space, note-taking, homework
- Social
 - Interacting with one another in groups, being a leader, Helper of the Week

- USE OF MULTIPLE RESOURCES BEYOND TEXTBOOKS (including our own minds)
 - EXPAND rather than limit learning & thinking
 - 21st Century Skills in digital form, too!
 (Creativity, Innovation, Critical Thinking,
 Collaboration, Communication,
 Problem-Solving, Life Skills, Media Literacy,
 Information Literacy, etc.)
 - Raise the Expectations with Appropriate Challenges (Essays, Online Research & Paraphrasing/Summarizing, Presentation Skills, Using Multiple Resources, etc.)
