NEW INFORMATION:

Phase II Lunch: Starting Monday October 4th.

- The Cafeteria will now offer:
 - Single Hot lunch, Deli sandwich, and salad (all still for free).
 - Students will be able to order Doubles (must pay--- \$2.45).
 - No money = No Doubles

- Parents are HIGHLY ENCOURAGED to add money to their child's account so we can just use student ID #'s instead of a cash exchange. This is much faster to get students served.
 - O 2 ways to do this:
 - 1. Child may bring in a check/cash to be loaded onto the student account manually by Pomptonian. (students can drop off to main office in an envelope with name to be preloaded prior to lunch or hand right to cashier)

Reading:

Reading is still the best thing a child can do in order to be successful at school. Below is a chart
that illustrates how reading benefits a child starting in Kindergarten. 20 minutes a day goes a
long way. It is never too late to start a reading routine. (See e-book resources provided by our
library below.)

If a child starts reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days. Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3 days.

Start Strong:

- The State of New Jersey is requiring all school districts to administer the "Start Strong" standardized assessment. As per the state, "This assessment is designed to produce information that should be used as a standards-based complement to the resources used by educators in their classrooms to evaluate the needs of students." The results will enable districts to obtain "... a data point to support curriculum and instructional planning."

 - Other Key information:
 - Testing is 45 minutes to 1 hour long for each subject.
 - Grades 3-6 will test in Language Arts/Literacy and Math
 - Just grade 6 will test in Science
 - All accommodations for students with special programs will be in place.
 - Results are supposed to come out in the late Fall.

Drop-Off:

• Drop off and student entrances with temperature checks have been smooth. Thank-you for helping with that. Since everyone knows where they are going at this point, and as we get into full swing, we are going to tighten up entrance a little bit.

• Drop-Off Timeline:

- o 8:00am- supervision provided at each entrance, with temperature checks, for students being dropped off to school.
- 8:19am- students enter the building.
- 8:23am- late bell sounds. Outside doors will close. <u>All students arriving who can not get</u> to their entrance by 8:23am, should then proceed to the front of the building to be let in through the main office. (when in doubt, go to the main office)
