New Jersey's New Test!

This year we are having a different state test, the PARCC. Instead of the paper and pencil NJASK we will be taking the PARCC test this year. On December 4, 2014 we took a practice test for it to prepare ourselves for the one that will be sent to the state. The PARCC test is computerized so it has many functions that the NIASK doesn't; like highlighting, magnifiers, a red X that when you click on an answer you know is wrong it crosses it out. There is also a review and flag but-

ton. A review button shows you if you accidently skipped or missed a question. Also, a review button shows you which questions you flagged. When you flag a question it tells you that you had a hard time and skipped the question to do it later. When you click review you can see all the questions you have flagged and go back to them. You can use rulers, protractors, and calculators if provided which are helpful. To go to the next question you have to click the top two arrows.

Like in Microsoft Word. when answering a question you can bold, italicize, and underline. There are also questions where you can drag and drop sentences into their correct boxes. After the last question you can submit your answers by hitting the green submit button. Since every job now requires computer skills, the state tests have now become computerized. This more interactive test has proved to be more enjoyable than the NJASK.


