The Tower Garden Comes To Highland

Currently, Highland School has its very own Tower Garden run by the 6th Grade Enrichment students. They are growing things such as Basil, Arugula, Bok Choy, Rainbow Swiss Chard, Red Cherry Tomatoes, Bibb lettuce, lettuce blends, and much more. After harvesting a few more times, they may replant some of the veggies.

You may wonder, "How does the Tower Garden work?" Well, there are many steps to the process. The first step is to buy the seeds for the plants. After, you put these spongey cubes into a tray. They are called rockwool. They look like little sponges and feel like them except they have little holes in the middle for the seeds. The second step is to wet the sponges and to plant the seeds. You simply wet the sponges with water and then place the seeds in the holes. The third step is to let them sit for 2-3 weeks. This is so that the seedlings can sprout. Once they are about 3 inches tall, they can be planted into the actual garden. Before you can plant the plants, you have to fill the garden with water. The garden can hold up to 20 gallons. Typically, you should use about 15-20 gallons. After the water, you pour in the nutrients. To make sure you added enough of each nutrient, you test the ph levels. If they are good, the garden is ready! If they aren't good, you have to keep adding and changing the ratios until the levels are good. Once they are good, you turn on the tower garden and watch how the plants grow over time.

The Tower Garden runs on cycles. It will be on for a few hours with water running through the middle and be off for a few hours. The water and nutrients running through the middle and the lights outside of the garden provide great care for the plants. If the Tower Garden isn't plugged in, even if it is just for a couple of days, the plants will die and it will be hard to get them to regrow.

So far, the Tower Garden has been harvested a couple of times. The 6th grade Enrichment is continuing to grow and use the plants. The Tower Garden is truly a healthy, clean, and great option for growing plants!

Gerrit Cole is an All Star baseball player. He was named the National League Pitcher of the Month for April 2015, which is a pretty cool thing to be named. He played for the Pittsburgh Pirates and Houston Astros. Speaking of the Astros, he helped them get to the World Series in 2017 and 2019. He was born in 1990 in the town of Newport Beach, California.

For college he went to UCLA, University of California, Los Angeles, and played for the UCLA Bruins. After he played for the Bruins, the Pittsburgh Pirates made Cole their first pick for the MLB Draft of 2011. He made his debut in 2013. Within that same year he was named National League Rookie of the Month for September. He was traded to the Astros in the off season of 2017-2018.

On September 18, 2019, Gerrit Cole became the 18th pitcher in major league history to strike out at least 300 batters in a season. That is a pretty big accomplishment! On December 16, 2019, he signed a \$324,000,000 contract with the Yankees. This is the largest contract in major league history for a pitcher.

He brought the sign he made for the 2001 World Series to his contract signing. He will pitch in spring training and also on opening day for the Yankees. 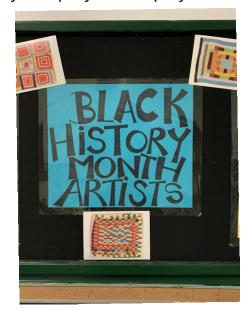

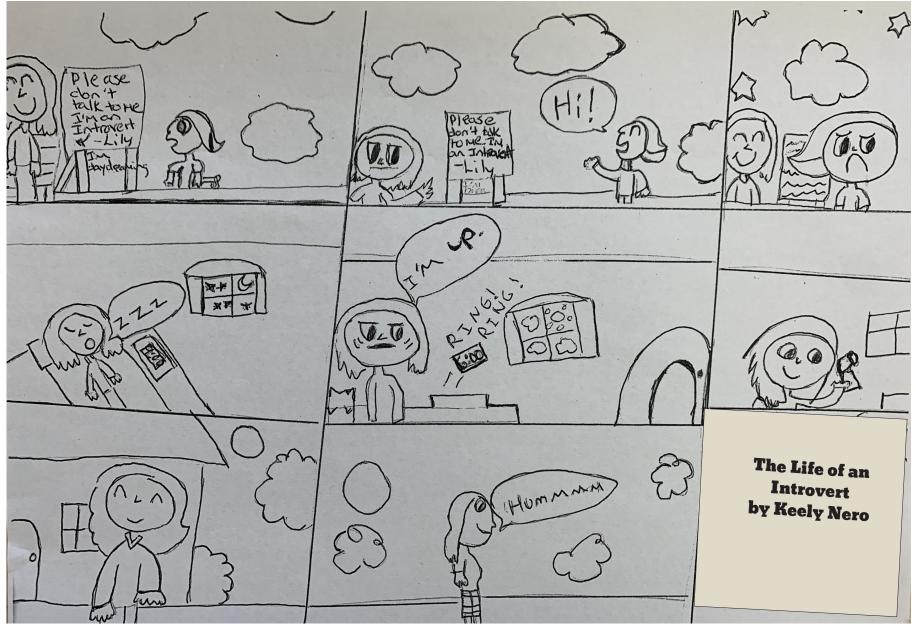

Super Awesome Brownie Recipe 1/2 cup butter, 1 cup granulated sugar, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 3 eggs, 2 cups flour, 1 1/2 cups semi-sweet chips, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1/4 teaspoon salt

- 1. Grease a 7 inch baking pan, then line with parchment paper.
- 2. Melt semi-sweet chocolate chips and butter for two minutes in the microwave on low.
- 3. In another bowl, put white and brown sugar. Add eggs in one at a time. Mix for two minutes until it is creamy.
- 4. Mix in salt, vanilla, and flour. Next, add in the melted chocolate/butter mixture and stir everything together. For extra chocolate flavor, you can add in cocoa powder, broken pieces of candy, or even hot chocolate mix. Yum!
- 5. Pour the mixture into the pan. Bake for 30 minutes at 350 degrees.
- 6. Let the brownies cool and then eat!
