What is a privilege?

EXAMPLE: STUDY HALL IS A PRIVILEGE THAT THE 5TH AND 6TH GRADERS EARN

- Students may use the Media center instead of going to recess on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.
- Sign in neatly with 1st name, last name, and HR
- Students should not bring their Chromebooks because Chromebooks cannot be brought to lunch room). There are 12 available in the Media Center.
- You should be productively working/studying/ reading
- No eating or drinking
- Students must clean up after themselves, including any student supplies or maker materials (Lego, blocks, etc.).
- NO TALKING unless working on a group project. IT IS A LIBRARY.
- No hanging out just to hang out- that is what recess is for.
- If too many students arrive you will be sent back to recess and should report immediately to the recess location.
- BEFORE YOU LEAVE: sign out of google, close all browsers, push chairs in, collect belongings, line up at door and wait to be dismissed. (DO NOT LEAVE UNTIL DISMISSED)

You can lose this privilege



A REFRESH OF BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS:

- No Touching: When you put your hands on someone you are leaving yourself vulnerable to getting in trouble.
 - This includes other peoples stuff.
- Be Aware of the consequences associated with your <u>foul language</u>
 - *F-Bomb* = Suspension
 - Calling someone Gay, Retarded, Fat, or anything related to 'making fun of' will get you in trouble, i.e. parent conferences, suspension, HIB Investigation (Harassment, Intimidation, Bullying) and loss of privileges.
 - This includes text messaging and social media outside of school when it becomes a substantial issue inside school.
 - No need to say 'sucks', 'crap' etc in a classroom. We are in school.
- <u>Disrespect</u>: It is disrespectful to... Ignore a teachers directions, roll your eyes at a teacher, look up pictures on your Chromebook when you are supposed to be working, and just not doing work.
- Phones in school- if we see it out we can take it— you have been forewarned. This includes at your lockers before and after school. Cell phone Free Zone- please practice self control.

- Academic Honors:

 - Honor Roll All A's and 3 B's
- Do not be absent from school
- Do not be late to school
- Just try hard if you try hard you will not fail.
- •6th graders should be more independent than rest of school.





LET'S TIGHTEN SOME THINGS UP- EASY FIXES

- 1:1 Chromebooks are a privilege:
 - If you do not charge your Chromebook at home like you are supposed to it will be kept in school. You will lose the privilege of taking the Chromebook home.
 - Google Backgrounds should be school appropriate.
 - Why are you e-mailing each other instead of working?
 - Gaming can be an addiction- are you addicted. Stop gaming all the time.
- Please and thank-you's go a long way.
- Let's become more <u>independent</u>: (You should be independent learners)
 - Ex: Asking how to do things that they can do for yourself.
 - "How do you spell..." What it the definition of?"
 - Where do I put my name?
 - Asking what do I do after the teacher JUST GAVE DIRECTIONS.
 - Students with the privilege of enrichment should be working like enrichment students.
- Do not let Social Drama come into the classroom- what happens at lunch, stays at lunch.
- Can we please walk like mature adults in the hallways and STAIRWELLS after lunch (single file not yelling).
- Close your lockers and lock them please. Some of you have to get better at this. (2 lockers next year)
- Follow Directions- pay attention to detail.
- Can we please do HW and Study? You have student support time to go see another teacher. Teachers have extra help days- ask them
- Your paper is not submitted on Google Classroom UNTIL YOU HIT SUBMIT, so hit submit.
- Be prepared for class. It is not OK if you do not have a pencil, or highlighter or binder, HW, etc. Please figure
 it out. You should be nervous to show up unprepared.

OTHER REMINDERS- APPLIES TO SOME OF YOU, NOT ALL OF YOU

- Teachers & Students—
 - Teachers are adults and you are children. Children historically must listen to adults because-
 - WE KNOW WHAT IS BEST FOR YOU IN SCHOOL
 - WE HAVE BEEN YOUR AGE AND UNDERSTAND
 - When speaking to an adult, understand we are not your friends- we would love to be, but we are not.
 - Stop wasting so much of your time in class (looking up pictures on google)
 - You should not be going to the bathroom every period.
 - Do not start off sentences with "but I thought..."
 (please stop making excuses).
 - No making weird noises during class that do not make sense at all and make us nervous because they are so weird.





AS YOU GET OLDER, YOU GET MORE FREEDOM, BUT YOU INHERIT MORE RESPONSIBILITY-

You are going to be held accountable for not working hard, misbehaving, coming to school late, or not coming to school at all, etc.

SO WHAT IS FAIR REALLY?

- •Is it fair that a student who works hard by studying, doing all HW, participating in class everyday and earns A's, B, even C's eats a cheeseburger at the end of year Bar-B-Q next to their friend who did nothing and failed two subjects?
 - •Is it fair that a student who is nice to everyone, never gets in trouble and helps out the school gets the same privileges as someone who has been suspended 2-3 times?
- Is it fair that someone who is late 30 times in a half year gets to go on the same number of trips that a student who was only late 2 times?



LOSS OF PRIVILEGES-

- For every subject you are failing for the year you will lose a privilege. (May 15)
 - Ex. if you are failing S.S. and Music you will lose two privileges. (Maybe BarBQ & YMCA trip)
- If you are failing a class, you are not allowed to go to clubs and/or Musical (March 1st)
- Excessive tardiness will result in loss of a privilege (12 in a semester (1/2 year))
- Excessive Unexcused Absences will result in the loss of a privilege (13 unexcused for the year)
- Repeated poor behavior that results in Suspensions and/or HIB investigations or excessive detentions will result in a loss of privilege(s).





Many of you are, but are all of you?


