
District Security Guard:

We will have another 'No Chromebook Day' on Friday January 19th, 2024. Though we know one day of no Chromebook may not change much, it does bring awareness and create conversation about screen time.

Highland Spelling Bee 2024:

The annual Spelling Bee at Highland has begun. The field has been narrowed down to 2 students from each homeroom that will have a giant spell off until only 1 champion is left standing. The finals will take place on February 2nd. Last year's winner, Xavier McCarthy, advanced to the county competition where he ranked in the top 14 of spellers in the county.

Simple Housekeeping Items:

- **Picking up Children Early**: We know many parents in the district and do not always ask for ID when picking up your child because we know exactly who you are. However, sometimes grandparents or other family members/emergency contacts will pick up a child, which is allowed, but we must see their ID. We will not release a student to anyone whose identify has not been verified.
- **Hygiene**: Please have kids brush their teeth and some will start needing deodorant especially in the spring. If you can smell them, we can smell them.
- **Requesting work**: If a child is out sick for more than one day and you would like work, please try to request the work prior to 9am so we can ensure we can get it together. Some teachers have a prep period first period and then teach the rest of the day except for lunch. This will help us get it together. All work can be picked up outside the office.
- Social Media: Social Media can be a wonderful thing, even Highland is on Instagram right now. But, please do not post private teacher-parent emails on Social Media. There is a disclaimer on all mpsnj.org emails outlining the expectation. Obviously this is a slippery slope to start going down.
- Attendance: I know there is a lot of sickness going around nowadays. With the weather 54 degrees one day and then dropping to 27 degrees 18 hours later it is tough to stay healthy. I am getting nervous about attendance. When I run an attendance report it gives me categories so I can focus on students. You can see by the chart and graph below that 21% of our students at this time are falling into the Unsatisfactory/Chronically absent range (over 60 students). To be considered chronically absent by the state, a student must be out for 10% of the school days (that is absent 1 day every 10 school days). The state does not recognize excused absences, that is a district thing.

The Car Line:

- All across America the drop off car lines at elementary schools can be stressful. We have been doing okay
 so far considering over 300 students are being dropped off in a 20 minute span- THANK-YOU. Traffic is
 not backing up to the intersection of Prospect and Godwin as much.
 - Reminders of things we can do to keep the car line moving:
 - Pull all the way up as far as you can go, then let out your child(ren). Have student exit the vehicle on left side whenever possible (safer).
 - Have student water bottles and backpacks ready to go, like a paratrooper ready to jump out of a plane. When the car stops it's a "Go, Go, Go."
 - Pre hug and kiss your child prior to getting in the car. Those are important things, but safety of kids during drop off is too. We want to avoid cars passing in line as much as possible.
 - If you find yourself U-turning anywhere, you are doing something illegal. Let's try not to do illegal things.

After School Pick Up:

After the bell rings at 2:50pm, students are released with the expectation that they will be watched, picked up by parents, or head to aftercare. Your child should not be playing outside if you are not present afterschool. There is limited supervision outside after school. Students who misbehave may be held accountable for their actions. Students will be released from the same door they entered in the morning so we do not have a stampede going out of one door. Please arrange a spot for your child to meet you or your 'picker-upper'. Those who walk home, please set a time for arrival home, and those who go to aftercare should head right over to Godwin so we do not have to send out a search party if they are late.
